Weekend art shows

Every Saturday and Sunday, there are a variety of performances at many outdoor attractions in Macau, with each show lasting about 20 minutes. Visitors can watch the Drunken Dragon Dance (a traditional celebration by people of the fishing industry), sophisticated performance of traditional Chinese martial arts and lion dance performances, the Cantonese opera with a history of more than 300 years, lively Portuguese folk dance, hip-hop deeply loved by young people, and a variety of dance performances. Each performance has its unique artistic style worthy of appreciation. Among them, the Drunken Dragon Dance and Cantonese Opera has been included in the list of National Intangible Cultural Heritage.

A Tour of Arts and Culture

Route

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Estimated time: Around 150 minutes
(The duration of stay is expected to be 5-10 minutes for each spot)



Macau Fisherman's Wharf is Macau's first themed large-scale entertainment complex. It is situated to the left of Ferry Terminal of the Outer Harbour, with a distance of a just 5 -minute walk. It is not purely a theme park, but also combines dining, shopping, entertainment and other facilities in one single location. Mouth-watering international foods, ranging from local snacks to African specialty foods, are readily available; a variety of products ranging from delicate souvenirs to international brands meet the different needs of customers; the amusement center combines theme park for children and advanced entertainment facilities, an attraction for a family visit.

Out of the Macau Fisherman's Wharf, walk across the street to the Sands Macau Hotel. Go through the square to the left of the hotel, you'll arrive at the **Macau Cultural Centre**⁽¹⁾. The adjacent building is the **Macau Museum of Art**⁽²⁾. To the left of the Macau Cultural Centre, there is the **Handover Gifts Museum of Macau**⁽³⁾. Out of the Museum, you will find that to the right there is a footbridge over the Avenida Dr. Sun Yat Sen. On the left of the footbridge, the **Macau Science Center** - designed by world-renowned Chinese-American architect I.M. Pei - is instantly recognizable by its silvery, cone-shaped exterior. There are fourteen exhibition halls arranged in a spiral and accentuated by an arch shape. Step out of the Macau Science Center, turn left towards the Sai Van Bridge direction, you can see the **Kun lam Ecumenical Centre**⁽⁴⁾.

Getting out of the Kun lam Ecumenical Centre, you can go across the street, continue to walk along the beach, and pass by many specialty restaurants and bars, where you can enjoy a sumptuous lunch or have a drink. Then move forward and pass by the hotels and shopping malls, while enjoying views of Nam Van Lake. After a ten-minute walk, you'll get to the **Macau Tower**⁽⁵⁾, which is a multi-purpose dining, shopping and entertainment facility, with the height of 338 meters.

Out of the Macau Tower, walk along the Avenida Doutor Stanley Ho, turn left at the Fire Department Building, and go straight through the Travessa do Lago Sai Van, you'll arrive at the Avenida da Republica. At the junction of the Avenida da Republica and Rua da Praia, there is a pink Portuguese building, the original headquarters building for the Macau Foundation. Proceed along the beach until the end of the Avenida da Republica, there is the Pousada de São Tiago Hotel, originally the Fortaleza de Barra. The hotel retains the original antique appearance of the fortress, akin to a medieval European castle. Then walk along the Rua de S. Tiago da Barra, you'll get to the **A-Ma Temple**, which is dedicated to Matsu, the goddess of seafarers and fishermen. Located on the southwest tip of the Macau Peninsula, the A-Ma temple is one of the



landmark buildings, and the oldest among the three major ancient temples of Macau. In 2005, the temple became one of the designated sites of the Historic Centre of Macau enlisted on UNESCO World Heritage List. In addition, during the weekend, there are various cultural performances (Portuguese folk dance, hip-hop, lion dance, etc.) at 15:00, 16:30 on Saturdays and at 12:00 on Sundays.

(1) The Cultural Center's main building (the complex of auditoria) has two venues for performances and an exhibition space. The Grand Auditorium is the venue for large-scale concerts and opera performances.
 (2) In the Macau Museum of Art, there are regularly exhibitions of Chinese paintings and calligraphy, seals, Shiwán ceramics, art and historical paintings, etc.; in addition, there are also special exhibitions.
 (3) The Handover Gifts Exhibition Hall is a three-storey building. It mainly exhibits the handover gifts presented by the State Council of The People's Republic of China, its country-wide provinces, municipalities, autonomous regions and Hong Kong Special Administrative Region.
 (4) The Kun lam Ecumenical Centre is designed by a female Portuguese sculptor and combines the style of traditional Buddhist culture of China and European sculpture; the lotus flower shaped dome is an ecumenical centre, which features two levels: the ground floor is a multi - function room, the second level is a basement , where a contemplation room and a small library are located.
 (5) Adventure activities such as Bungee jumping, Skywalk X can be found in the Macau Tower. There is also a 360° Café where visitors can sit down and enjoy the beautiful scenery of Macau while tasting the delicious food.
