


Macao Educational Tourism

In light of its unique background, Macao serves as a living museum, preserving and narrating stories that span centuries of cultural exchange. From the incense wafting through the A-Ma Temple to the stories echoing through the Ruins of St. Paul’s, each historic landmark narrates a tale of over 400 years of seamless East and West integration. Macao, once a major hub along the Maritime Silk Road, embodies a rich tapestry of Chinese history by intertwining traditions and innovations. In recent times, Macao has dazzled the global stage with its designations as the “Historic Centre of Macao”, “Creative City of Gastronomy”, and “Culture City of East Asia”, unveiling a tapestry of experiences that illuminate the city’s profound heritage and cultural richness.

Aside from its historical significance, Macao offers a wealth of opportunities for academic endeavours. Step into hidden industrial relics, engage with traditional craftsmanship, delve into integrated tourism enterprises, or explore the future development of low-carbon intelligence. Whether it’s history, culture, natural resources, or specific themes like technological advancements and ecological preservation, these educational resources enrich Macao as a global hub for tourism and leisure, offering students with a range of delights and distinctive experiences.

Part 1: Educational Resources in Macao



1. Historical Sites

The Historic Centre of Macao

On 15th July 2005, the Historic Centre of Macao was successfully inscribed as a World Heritage Site, making it the 31st site in China to be granted this status. Nestled within the ancient city of Macao, the urban enclave encompasses eight squares and 22 historic buildings. Representing the convergence of Eastern and Western influences cultivated over four centuries, the Historic Centre of Macao is currently the oldest, the most complete and consolidated array of European architectural legacy standing intact on Chinese territory today.

2. Gastronomic Culture

Macao's culinary landscape is a unique experience that reflects centuries of cultural exchange between the East and West. On 1st November 2017, Macao was designated as a UNESCO Creative City of Gastronomy, honouring the city's 400-year legacy of cultural exchange and culinary innovation. Macanese Gastronomy, one of the world's first examples of fusion food, was inscribed in the List of Intangible Cultural Heritage in 2012 and was enlisted in the National Intangible Cultural Heritage in 2021, with the Macao University of Tourism being the protection entity in the preservation and promotion of this culinary heritage.



3. Museums

Despite its modest size, Macao is a treasure trove of rich cultural heritage. Over a dozen museums scattered across this dynamic city, each offering a window into the fusion of Eastern and Western influences. In March and May 2022, the Macao Science Center (MSC) was selected by the China Association for Science and Technology (CAST) as one of the "National Science Popularization and Education Base" and "National Scientist Spirit Education Base" respectively. In recognition of endeavours by the MSC in promoting environmental protection and sustainable development, the MSC was presented with a plaque as a "green low-carbon" science popularisation and education base by the Chinese Society for Urban Studies in March 2024. Perched atop of the Mount Fortress, one of the Macao's heritage sites, the Macao Museum encompasses a rich collection of exhibits narrating the city's transformation. The Macao Grand Prix Museum pays tribute to drivers, teams, and iconic figures who have left their mark on this racing event since 1954 through multimedia interactive displays and a remarkable collection of historic race cars and motorcycles.

Macao Science Center

The Macao Science Center (MSC) stands as a destination for educational tours, integrating science popularisation education with its role as a tourist landmark and a regional platform for science education, convention and exhibition, and the dissemination of novel technologies. It has garnered esteemed titles such as “National Science Popularization and Education Base” and “National Scientist Spirit Education Base”.

The MSC is composed of an exhibition center, a planetarium awarded the highest resolution 3D planetarium in the world by the Guinness World Records, and a convention center, offering an extensive array of educational activities such as training programmes, workshops, and science themed dramas. It is also equipped with the “International Laboratory for Science Popularization of BeiDou Navigation Satellite System” (FabLab), the “Macao Laboratory of Information Technology Application and Innovation” (NetLab), Maker Space, and Tinker Space, leading the public, particularly teenagers, to embark on a fantastic journey of scientific exploration and learning.

Established on 19th March 1999, the Macao Museum of Art is the largest museum dedicated to cultural relics and arts in Macao. Housed in a five-storey building, the museum features various exhibition areas on each floor. The fourth floor is a sanctuary of traditional Chinese art. 

Lai Chi Yun Shipyards is one of the few remaining and well-preserved shipbuilding industrial sites in Macao, serving as a recreational and cultural space dedicated to the shipbuilding industry of Macao. The Former Iec Long Firecracker Factory retains its original layout and ambiance. It is one of the few remaining and fully intact firecracker industrial sites in Macao.



State Key Laboratory of Lunar and Planetary Science

The State Key Laboratory of Lunar and Planetary Science (SKLPlanets) at the Macau University of Science and Technology was officially established in 2018 with the support of the Ministry of Science and Technology of the People's Republic of China. Now, it serves as China's sole national major laboratory for astronomy and planetary sciences.


